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## INTRODUCTION

Congratulations on purchasing your Geemarc oCean400 telephone. This is a multifunction telephone which offers features such as hands free use, caller ID*, caller announce, dialling talking, a phone book and quick dial. It offers amplification, helpful for those with hearing difficulties. It has large buttons allowing easy use of the keypad and to help stop any misdialling. This telephone is compatible with hearing aids.
It is important that you read the instructions below in order to use your Geemarc telephone to its full potential. Keep this user guide in a safe place for future reference. This guide explains how to use the following telephone:

If you forget to connect the phone line cord, "No line" will show on the screen.

When you press the Menu soft key, the display will show the main menu. Use $\square$ or $\square$ key to scroll through the menu and select the desired option, then press Select soft key to confirm.


When a new call comes in, the screen will display the caller's phone number and/or name.

If the caller has exercised the option to prevent his name and number from being sent, "Private" will be shown on the display.

"Out of Area" will display when someone calls from an area where the telephone company is not offering the caller identification services or is not yet providing number delivery to your area.

## USING THE TELEPHONE

## Making a Call

1. To make a call, lift the handset, listen for a dial tone. Adjust your volume \& tone settings if required (see page 12).
2. You can dial a number using the keypad or press one of the memory dial buttons. Please refer to page 15 for memory calling.
3. To end the call, replace the handset on the base.

You can also enter the desired phone number in standby mode, which allows you to make corrections before dialling. Follow these steps:

1. Enter a telephone number (up to 32 digits). Check it. If you make a mistake while entering a number, press the Clear soft key to edit it.
2. When the number appears correctly, lift the handset or press the $\square$ key, the number will be dialled automatically.

## Last Number Redial

The
key is used to quickly redial the last number you dialled.

1. Lift the handset to get a dial tone.
2. Press the key. The phone will redial up to 17 digits automatically.

## Dialing a Number from the Redial List

1. Press the key in standby mode.

## USING THE TELEPHONE

2. Press $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly until you find the number you want to dial.
3. Pick up the handset or press the key to dial the number.

## Use Redial Book options

Using the redial book options, you can add a number to phone book or delete a number from the redial book.

1. Press the key in standby mode.
2. Scroll to the desired number by using the $\triangle$ or $\nabla$ key.
3. When the number appears, press the Options soft key to choose the desired option:

- Erase: allows you to delete the selected number.
- Erase all: allows you to delete the whole redial book.
- Store: allows you to add the number to the phone book. Enter a name you want to use with this number, then press the Save soft key (See page 21)

4. To exit, press the Back soft key.

## Receiving a Call

When a new call is received the phone will ring and the Visual ring indicator will flash.

1. To answer a call, lift the handset and speak.
2. Adjust your volume \& tone settings if required (see page 12).
3. To end the call, replace the handset on the base.

## USING THE TELEPHONE

## Muting the Microphone

During a conversation, you can temporarily switch your phone's microphone off so that the other party cannot hear you speak.
To mute your microphone, press the $\underbrace{}_{\otimes}$ key during the conversation. "Mute" appears on the LCD.
To unmute your microphone, press the key. The other party will be able to hear you once again.

## Using the Amplification Function

Your phone is equipped with a specialized amplification function. During a conversation you can adjust the

Volume Controls or ond Tone control of to satisfy your hearing requirements.
The handset receiver volume adjustment is $0-30 \mathrm{~dB}$. The TONE control allows you to either boost low or high frequency range.
CAUTION: This telephone can produce very high (loud) sound levels. Repeated incremental exposure to amplification levels greater than 18 dB may be harmful to people without hearing loss. Always adjust the volume control to the minimum setting after using the phone.

## Using your Phone with hearing aids

Your phone can be used with hearing aids equipped with a telecoil (T-coil). Adjust your hearing aid "T-switch" to the " T " position. Make sure to hold the handset close to your hearing aid.

## Headset Function

## Press

to activate the headset function. Plug the headset into the headset jack. The headset jack can be found at the rear of the phone. If you use this jack you can listen and speak through your headset.

## Hands-free

During a call, you may turn on the speakerphone. Whilst in this mode you can enjoy the comfort of a hands free conversation.
To turn the feature on during a call, press until icon appears, then replace the handset on the base. To turn the feature off, and keep on talking in normal mode(handset mode), simply pick up the handset. The icon will disappear.

## Adjusting Speaker Volume

In speaker mode you can adjust the speaker volume by using the Volume Controls or or located on the front panel of the phone.

## Hold Function

During a call, you can press the Hold soft key to put a call on hold and the LCD will display "Call on hold". Hanging up the handset will not disconnect the call. To continue the conversation, simply pick up the handset or press the Unhold soft key.

## Ringer Setting

You can select your own ringer tone and adjust the ringer volume. You can also adjust the ringer volume to "Ringer OFF" in order to turn off the ringer.

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press the $\nabla$ key to move to Set Phone and then press Select soft key.
3. Press Select soft key to choose Set Ring. Press Select soft key again to choose Ringer volume. You can choose among volume 1~volume 5. Every time you press the $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key, the phone rings with the selected volume level.
4. Press the Select soft key to confirm.
5. Press the $\nabla$ key to set the Ringer tone, press the Select soft key.
6. Press the $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to select the desired ringer tone. Each time you press the $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key, the phone rings with the selected ringer tone.
7. Press Select soft key to confirm and return to the previous menu.
In standby mode You can also adjust the ringer volume
by using the Volume Controls or or on the front panel of the phone. The display will show the current level. For example: volume 1.
WARNING: RING VOLUME IS VERY LOUD AND CAN DAMAGE YOUR HEARING. NEVER PUT YOUR EAR CLOSE TO THE RINGER.

## Speed Dial Setting

One-touch Memory
Your phone allows you to program 7 frequently used one-touch memory numbers [M1~M3 or 3 photo memory dial keys (M5~M7) or SOS (M4) Key]. Each memory key can store up to 24 digits.

## Storing Memory Numbers

1. Use the keypad to enter the number you want to store. You can use the Clear soft key to edit the number.
2. Press and hold one of the Memory dial keys [M1~M3 or 3 photo memory dial keys(M5~M7) or SOS (M4) Key], the display shows Number:. Edit it if necessary. Press Save soft key.
3. The display shows Name:, enter the name you want to use for this number. Use the Clear soft key to edit it if required. Press the Save soft key (see page 21).
4. Press $\square$ or $\square$ key to select the ring you would like to associate with the number, press the Select key to confirm.
Note: Entering a new number in the same location will automatically erase the previous number.

## Viewing and Dialling Memory Numbers

In standby mode press one of the Memory dial keys [M1~M3 or 3 photo memory dial keys(M5~M7) or SOS (M4) Key], the display will show the corresponding number. Lift the handset or press the key to dial it out.

## Using the Options

1. In standby mode press one of the Memory dial keys [M1~M3 or 3 photo memory dial keys (M5~M7) or SOS (M4) Key].
2. Press Options soft key to choose the desired option:

- Play Voice: allows you to play the voice prompt of this entry. If you have recorded the name for this entry, the system will announce the name, otherwise it can only announce the number.
- Record Voice: allows you to record the name for the selected entry.
- Erase Voice: allows you to delete the name you have recorded for the selected entry.
- Edit: allows you to edit the selected entry.
- Erase: allows you to delete the selected entry.

Note: If you record a voice prompt for an entry, an icon

## Two-touch Memory

Your phone allows you to program 10 frequently two-touch memory numbers (0~9). Each memory key can store up to 24 digits.

## Storing Memory Numbers

1. Use the keypad to enter the number you want to store. You can use the Clear soft key to edit the number.
2. Press the key.
3. Press one of the numeric keys (0~9), the display shows Number:. Edit it if necessary. Press Save soft key.

## USING THE TELEPHONE

4. The display shows Name: enter the name your want to use with the number. Use the Clear soft key to edit it if necessary. Press the Save soft key. (See page 21).
5. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key to select the ring you like to associate with the number, press the Select key to confirm.
Note: Entering a new number in the same location will automatically erase the previous number.

## Viewing and Dialling Memory Numbers

In standby mode press and hold one of the numeric keys (0~9), the display will show the corresponding number. Lift the handset or press the key to dial it out.

## Using the Options

1. In standby mode press and hold one of the numeric keys (0~9).
2. Press Options soft key to choose the desired option:

- Play Voice: allows you to play the voice prompt of this entry. If you have recorded the name for this entry, the system will announce the name, otherwise it can only announce the number.
- Record Voice: allows you to record the name for the selected entry.
- Erase Voice: allows you to delete the name you have recorded for the selected entry.
- Edit: allows you to edit the selected entry.
- Erase: allows you to delete the selected entry.

Note: If you record a voice prompt for an entry, an icon form will appear before the name of this entry.

## USING THE TELEPHONE

## Flash Signal

When the line is engaged, pressing the R key sends the flash signal. This key is used in conjunction with special services (e.g. call waiting) which might be available for your phone network. For further details please contact your telephone network company.

To use the said special services, just press the while the line is engaged.

Note: This key only operates when your telephone has been installed for Tone mode (Dialing Mode menu must be set to Tone option).

## CALLER ID

This telephone automatically displays an incoming caller's number/name along with the date and time of the call. It will record up to 20 calls of up to 16 digits and store the data into memory.
IMPORTANT: You must subscribe to the Caller ID Service from your local telephone company to utilize this feature.

## Viewing the Caller List

 Use $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key to scroll through entries. Records will be listed in the order they were received.
## Dialing a Number from the Caller List

 Use $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key to scroll to the desired number. Then pick up the handset or press the key to dial it out.

## Using the Caller List Options

1. Use $\triangle$ or $\nabla$ key to locate the desired record.
2. Press Options soft key to choose the desired option:

- Erase: allows you to delete the selected entry.
- Erase all: allows you to delete all the entries.
- Store: allows you to add the entry to the phonebook. Note: If you select Erase all, a message "Erase all?" will ask you to confirm or not. Press Yes to confirm or No to cancel.


## PHONE BOOK

The phonebook built in to your phone allows you to store frequently used numbers so that you can easily make a call without having to remember or manually enter the phone number.

## Character Map

To enter a specific alphanumeric character, press the relevant key one or more times key for the required character according to the following table. Press once for the first character, twice for the second and so on. E.g. Press number 2 three times to enter "C".

- If you want to shift the case between upper and lower, while entering letters, press the * key.
- When entering the same letter twice or a different letter with the same key, wait for a few seconds for the cursor to move automatically and then select the next letter.

## Adding the Phonebook Entries

1. Enter a phone number (up to 24 digits) while in standby mode and then press Save soft key.
2. The display shows Number:. Edit it if necessary. Press Save soft key.
3. The display shows Name:, enter the name you want to use, then press Save soft key.
4. Press $\triangle \mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key to select the ring you would like to associate with the number, press the Select key to confirm.
Notes: If you make a mistake while entering a name or a number, use the Clear soft key to correct it. Each time you press this key, the last digit is deleted.

## Viewing the Phonebook Entries

1. Press the PhoneBk soft key in standby mode to enter the phonebook.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly until the desired entry is displayed.
3. Lift the handset or press the

key to dial out this number.

Note: If you have activated the Review Talking feature in advance, every time you press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key, the system will announce the number of the entry that appears on the display.

1. Press PhoneBk soft key to enter the phonebook.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly until the desired entry appears.

- Play Voice: allows you to play the voice prompt of this entry. If you have recorded the name for this entry, the system will announce the name, otherwise it can only announce the number.
- Record Voice: allows you to record the name for the selected entry.
- Erase Voice: allows you to delete the name you have recorded for the selected entry.
- Edit: allows you to edit the selected entry.
- Erase: allows you to delete the selected entry.

Note: If you record a voice prompt for an entry, an icon fo will appear before the name of this entry.

## Menu Navigation

To access a menu option:

## Set Display

Using this feature, you can customize the display settings, according to your taste and needs (language, contrast, hour format and date format).

## Language Setting

The phone supports up to 3 predefined languages:
English, French, German. You can change the language used to display the menu messages.

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press Select soft key to access Set Display.
3. Press Select soft key to select Set Language.
4. Press $\quad \mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key repeatedly to scroll through the options. Each language will be displayed in its own native translation.
5. Press Select soft key to select the required language.

## LCD Contrast Setting

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press Select soft key to access Set Display.
3. Press the $\triangle$ or $\square$ key to move to Set Contrast, press Select soft key.
4. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key repeatedly to choose among the 8 available contrast levels and then press Select soft key.

## SETTINGS

## Switch to smaller font

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press Select soft key to access Set Display.
3. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to Dim:X--->x, press Select soft key.
4. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\square$ key repeatedly to choose ON or OFF and then press Select soft key.
Note: If you select ON, when you pre-dial a number, if the number exceeds 8 digits, the font will be switched to smaller size automatically.

## Hour Format Setting

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press Select soft key to access Set Display.
3. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to Hour Format, press Select soft key.
4. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key repeatedly to choose 12 hour clock or $\mathbf{2 4}$ hour clock and then press Select soft key.
Note: If you select $\mathbf{1 2}$ hour clock, AM/PM will appear on the right of the time in standby mode.

## Date Format Setting

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press Select soft key to access Set Display.
3. Press $\triangle$ or $\nabla$ key repeatedly to move to Date Format, press Select soft key.
4. Press $\triangle$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to choose DD/MM or MM/DD and then press Select soft key.

## Keypad Tones Setting

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press the $\nabla$ key to move to Set Phone and then press Select soft key.
3. Press Select soft key to access Set Ring.
4. Press the $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key to choose Keypad Tones, then press Select soft key.
5. You can use $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key to choose ON or OFF to enable or disable the function.
6. Press the Select soft key.

## Call Waiting

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press the $\nabla$ key to move to Set Phone and then press Select soft key.
3. Press the $\nabla$ key to move to Call Waiting and then press Select soft key. The display shows the current setting.
4. Use $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key to select ON/OFF to activate/deactivate the call waiting function, press Select soft key to confirm.

## Flash Time Setting

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press the $\nabla$ key to move to Set Phone and then press Select soft key.

## SETTINGS

3. Press $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key repeatedly to move to Set Flash and then press Select soft key. The display shows the current setting.
4. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to choose among $100 \mathrm{~ms}, \mathbf{3 0 0 m s}$ and $\mathbf{6 0 0 m s}$, press Select soft key to confirm.

## Dialing Mode Setting

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press the $\nabla$ key to move to Set Phone and then press Select soft key.
3. Press $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to Dialing Mode and then press Select soft key. The display shows the current setting.
4. Press $\triangle$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to choose between Tone and Pulse, press Select soft key to confirm.

## Notes:

- This menu is not used in countries where only Tone dialing is available.
- If you are not sure which dialing mode to select, please contact your local service provider.


## Auto On Hook

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press the $\nabla$ key to move to Set Phone and then press Select soft key.

## SETTINGS

3. Press $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key repeatedly to move to AUTO ON HOOK and then press Select soft key. The display shows the current setting.
4. Use $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key to choose ON or OFF to activate or deactivate the auto on hook feature.
5. Press the Select soft key to confirm.

NOTE: The Auto On Hook Feature as detailed on page 31 will in most cases not work in the UK. For this function to operate the telephone Network that you are connected with has to give a busy tone when the call is ended by the other party. (tone signal: 425 Hz at $0.5 \mathrm{~s} / 0.5 \mathrm{~s}$ )

## New call LED

If you activate this feature, the new call LED will flash to indicate that you have new call to be reviewed.

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press the $\nabla$ key to move to Set Phone and then press Select soft key.
3. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to New call LED. and then press Select soft key.
4. Use $\triangle$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key to choose ON, OFF to activate or deactivate this feature.
5. Press the Select soft key to confirm.

## SETTINGS

## Setting Date \& Time

In standby mode, the phone displays the current date and time to help you keep track of your appointments. You need to set the date and time so that when you receive calls they will appear with the correct date and time.

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key repeatedly to move to Date and Time, press Select soft key. The current settings are displayed.
3. Enter the current time using the numeric keypad, press Save soft key.
4. Enter the current date using the numeric keypad, press Save soft key.
5. Enter the current year using the numeric keypad, press Save soft key.
Note: You can select the hour format and date format.
Please refer to Hour Format Setting and Date Format Setting on Pages 26.

## Set Talk

## Dialing Talking

This feature allows you to check the number you have entered in standby mode without looking at the display. 1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press $\quad \mathbf{\square}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to Set Talk, press Select soft key.
3. Press Select soft key to access DIALING TALKING.
4. Use $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key to select ON/OFF to activate / deactivate the dialing talking function, press Select soft key to confirm.

## SETTINGS

## CID Talking

The talking CID can announce the number that comes in unless the caller blocks the number. Note that if you have stored a number in phone book and recorded the corresponding name, when an incoming call with this number comes in, the system will announce the name associated with this number.

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to Set Talk, press Select soft key.
3. Press the t key to move to CID TALKING, press Select soft key.
4. Use $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key to select ON/OFF to activate/deactivate the CID talking function, press Select soft key to confirm.

## Review Talking

The system can announce the number that is stored in phone book when you are reviewing the phone book. This feature allows you to check these numbers when you use $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key to scroll through the phone book entries. Note that if you have recorded the corresponding name, the system will announce the name associated with this number instead of the number. To activate this feature, take the following steps:

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press $\mathbf{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to Set Talk, press Select soft key.
3. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to

REVIEW TALKING, press Select soft key.

## SETTINGS

4. Use $\triangle$ or $\nabla$ key to select ON/OFF to activate/deactivate the CID talking function, press Select soft key to confirm.

## Voice Prompt

You are able to select the language used to play the voice prompt messages.

1. Press Menu soft key to display the main menu list.
2. Press $\triangle$ or $\square$ key repeatedly to move to Set Talk, press Select soft key.
3. Press $\triangle$ or $\square$ key repeatedly to move to Voice Prompt, press Select soft key.
4. Use $\triangle$ or $\square$ key to scroll through the options. Each language will be displayed in its own native translation.
5. Press the Select soft key to choose the required language.

## SOS Setting

The SOS function allows you to ask for help with a one-touch operation if you are in an emergency. Note: You need to connect the adaptor for the SOS function.

To ask for help by one-touch operation
To use the SOS function you need to record a message that you want to tell the helper.

## Storing SOS Numbers

1. Press Menu soft key.

## SETTINGS

2. Press $\triangle$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to SET SOS, press Select soft key.
3. Press Select soft key to choose SOS NUMBER.
4. You can store 5 SOS numbers(1~5). Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key to select the number, press the Select soft key.
5. Enter the telephone number by numeric keypad (24 digits maximum for each memory). If you make a mistake you can press the Clear soft key to delete the previous digit if necessary.
6. Press the Save soft key to store the number.

## Recording SOS Message

You can use your phone to record SOS messages (up to 30 seconds).

1. Press Menu soft key.
2. Press $\triangle$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to SET SOS, press Select soft key.
3. Press $\nabla$ key to choose SOS SOUND, press Select soft key.
4. Press the $\nabla$ key to select RECORD SOUND and press Select soft key to confirm. You can record a message within 30 seconds.

## Notes:

- In the message, you should tell the helper to press one of the special buttons ( $0 \sim 9,{ }^{*}, \#$ ) to confirm that your SOS message has been received.
- If you want to record a message for less than 30 seconds, you can press the End soft key to confirm and exit.

## Playing SOS Message

1. Press Menu soft key.
2. Press $\triangle$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to SET SOS, press Select soft key.
3. Press $\nabla$ key to choose SOS SOUND, press Select soft key..
4. Press Select soft key to choose PLAY SOUND. You can press the End soft key to stop during the playing.

## SOS Emergency Dialing

After setting the SOS numbers and message, you can use the SOS function. Press the SOS key on the base phone to dial 5 SOS numbers one by one until someone responds. The telephone will dial the first SOS number. If there is no response in 30 seconds or the line is busy, the telephone will dial the second SOS number. If there is still no response in 30 seconds or the line is still busy, the telephone will dial the next number in turn until all the numbers you set are dialled three times. To cancel the SOS calling, press and hold the SOS key on the base for about 5 seconds.
After 5 minutes, you will hear a beeping tone, at this point the helper must press one of the special buttons ( $0 \sim 9,{ }^{*}, \#$ ) to continue the SOS call otherwise the conversation will stop after one minute.

## Auto Turn On

1. Press Menu soft key.
2. Press $\triangle$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to SET SOS, press Select soft key.

3. Press the $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\nabla$ key to choose Auto turn on, press Select soft key.
4. Press $\triangle$ or $\quad \nabla$ key to choose ON or OFF, press Select soft key.

## Security ID

1. Press Menu soft key.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key repeatedly to move to SET SOS, press Select soft key.
3. Press $\boldsymbol{\Delta}$ or $\boldsymbol{\nabla}$ key to choose Security ID, press Select soft key.
4. The display shows the current security ID. Enter the new one you want to use, press Save soft key.

After you have turned on " Auto turn on " and set the Pin code, the following will happen:
If your phone rings 10 times without being answered, the phone will set to auto off-hook (In this state, you can hear the caller but cannot answer the call. Two "bip-bip" tones will be generated to remind the caller to enter Pin code (the default one is *0000) to enter full speaker state. The caller enters the Pin code, and then starts the conversation. Every 2 minutes later, the caller will hear a prompt tone. The caller needs to press any button to continue the conversation. Otherwise, the line will be disconnected automatically.
NOTE: When the phone is auto off-hook, you can press the $\sim$ key to enter full speaker state. In this way, there is no need for caller to enter Pin code.

## CALLER ID ON CALL WAITING

When you subscribe to Call Waiting service from your local telephone company and activate the Call Waiting function via menu, the telephone will display the name and number of the second caller while you are having a conversation.

1. When you are on the line, the telephone will automatically display the name and number of the second caller.
2. Press the ${ }_{R}$ key to answer the second caller.
3. When you have finished, press the $\bigcirc_{\mathrm{R}}$ key to continue your conversation with the first caller.

- Make sure the ringer is not turned off.
