# 2. SET UP THE TELEPHONE

### 2.1 Package Contents

The package contains the following items:

- 1 Base station
- 1 Cordless handset
- 1 AC power adapter
- · 3 NiMH rechargeable batteries
- 1 Telephone line cord
- 1 User's manual

#### 2.2 Location


For maximum coverage and the reduction of interference, here are some guidelines you should consider where you place the base unit,

- Place it at a convenient, high, and central location with no obstructions between the handset and base unit in an indoor environment.
- Place it away from electronic appliances such as televisions, microwave ovens, radios, personal computers, wireless devices or other cordless phones.
- Avoid facing radio frequency transmitters, such as external antennas of mobile phone cell stations.
- Avoid plugging it into the same circuit as other major household electrical appliances because of the potential of interference. Try moving the other appliance or the base unit to another power outlet.

If the reception for a base unit location is not satisfactory, move it to another location for better reception.

Depending on the surrounding conditions as well as spatial and structural factors, the phone's signal range may be reduced. The range indoors is normally less than outdoors.

## 2.3 Connect the Corded Base Station



## Connecting the telephone

Connect the telephone cable to the telephone line socket ( $\bf A$ ) and to the telephone wall socket ( $\bf B$ ).

Connect the power adapter jack to the base (and DC charger) ( $\mathbf{C}$ ) then connect the power adapter plug in mains power ( $\mathbf{D}$ ).

#### NOTE

Use only the power adapter supplied with the base station.

## 2.4 Install and Charge the Handset Battery

1. Slide the battery cover downwards.
Install the 3 batteries into the socket as indicated, matching correct polarity (+,-).




- 2. Align the cover flat against the battery compartment, and then slide it upwards Until it clicks into place.
  - Charge the handset by placing it face forward in the base. You hear a beep when the handset is charging in the charger.
  - 4. Charge the batteries for at least 12 hours when charging for the first time.

#### NOTES

Only use the batteries provided or NiMH type rechargeable batteries.
 If the handset is not going to be used for a period of time, remove the batteries from the handset to prevent any possible battery leakage.

In idle mode: Press and hold for a couple of seconds to activate the

#### 10. TONE KEY

**During a call**: press this key to increase the high frequency or the low frequencies. (treble, standard or bass)

In main menu mode: Press to go back to idle screen.

In sub-menu mode: Press to go back to previous menu.





#### c. Text and Digit Entry Table

The following tables show you where each letter and punctuation character can be found. This will be helpful when storing a name in the phonebook or renaming your handset

In editing mode, a cursor is displayed to indicate the current text entry position. It is positioned at the right of the last character entered.

#### Writing Tips:

- 1. Once a character is selected, the cursor will move to the next position after a short pause.
- 2. You can move the cursor within the text by ▲/▼ to amend the text entry.
- 3. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** on the handset to delete the last character.
- 4. <u>Press and hold</u> **RIGHT SOFTKEY** on the handset to delete the entire text string.

# 4. USE YOUR PHONE

#### 4.1 Make an External Call

#### 4.1.1 Preparatory (Pre) Dialing

#### Using a handset:

Enter the phone number and press \to dial the number. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** \to clear the entry.

#### 4.1.2 Direct Dialing

#### Using a handset:

Press \to open the line, and then dial the phone number.

#### 4.1.3 Call from the Phonebook

#### Using a handset:

- Press ♥ ▼ to access the phonebook list and press ▲ ▼ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- 2. Press to dial the selected entry. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

#### 4.1.4 Call from the Call List

## Using a handset:

1. Press to access the call list.

#### OR

- 1. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to enter the main menu.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY to enter CALL LOG
- 3. Press▲ ▼ to select the desired call list entry.
- Press to dial the selected call list entry. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

#### 4.1.5 Call from the Redial List

#### Using a handset:

- 1. Press to access the redial list.
- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired redial number.
- Press \ to dial the selected redial number. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

#### 4.1.6 Call Timer

Your handset automatically times the duration of each call. The call timer will display a few seconds after the call has ended. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM: SS).

#### 4.2 Answer a Call

## Using a handset:

If the handset is not in the charging cradle or the base station:

When the phone rings, press \infty to answer a call. Press it again to turn on the speakerphone.

If the handset is in the charging cradle or the base station: When the phone rings, pick up the handset to answer a call.

#### 4.3 BOOSTER Function

The BOOSTER function allows you to amplify the handset earpiece volume to compensate for the person using the phone's limited hearing.

## Using a handset:

#### To turn on the BOOSTER function:

- Press SOS at any time during a call. "BOOST ON" displays on the handset screen and the red LED on the top turns on.
- When the BOOSTER function is activated, press ▲/▼ to increase or decrease the earpiece volume.
- The handset top indicator turns on as a visual reminder that the boost function is on

### To turn off the BOOSTER function and return the earpiece volume back to normal:

Press SOS again and the handset top indicator will turn off.

#### NOTE:

The audio boost feature will be turned off automatically when the call is ended To activate the booster at each call: see chapter 9.1.5

#### 4.4 End a Call

#### Using a handset:

During a call, press / to end the call. OR

Put the cordless handset in the charging cradle to end the call.

## 4.5 Adjust Earpiece and Speakerphone Volume

There are 6 levels (VOLUME 1 to VOLUME 6) to choose from for each of earpiece and speakerphone volume.

#### Using a handset: During a call:

Press ▲/▼ to select volume 1-6. The current setting is shown. When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

#### 4.6 Mute a Call

With the call muted, you can talk to someone nearby without letting the caller hear you during a call.

#### Using a handset: During a call:

Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (a) to mute the microphone and "MUTE ON" will be displayed on the handset screen. Your caller cannot hear you. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (a) again to resume the microphone.

#### 4.7 Redial the Last Number

You can redial up to 10 of the last numbers called on the cordless. If you have stored a name in the phonebook to match with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recently dialed number will be displayed at the top of the redial list.

#### 4.7.1 Redial a Number from the Redial List

#### Using a handset:

- 1. In idle mode, press to access the redial list.
- Press ▲▼ to browse the redial list.
- 3. Press \(\bullet\) to dial the selected redial number.

#### NOTE:

If there is no number in the redial list, the display will show "EMPTY".

## 4.7.2 Store a Redial Number into the Phonebook

## Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.7.1.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY (5) to select ADD TO PB.
- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** And check the phone number.
- 4. Press LEFT SOFTKEY **to enter the name**
- 5. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY to** save

#### 4.7.3 Delete a Redial Number

## Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.7.1.

Press LEFT SOFTKEY (5) to confirm

## 4.7.4 Delete the Entire Redial List

## Using a handset:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.7.1.
- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to confirm.

Press LEFT SOFTKEY ( to reconfirm

#### 4.8 Find the Handset

This feature helps you find the misplaced handset(s).

You can locate the handset by operation on the base station as below.

In idle mode, press A/HANDSETLOCATOR.

All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone, and "PAGING" will flash on the screen. You can stop the paging by pressing \( \sqrt{/} / \)

#### NOTE:

If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

#### 4.9 Make an Internal Call

This feature allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls and make conference calls. If the called handset is not answered within 60 seconds, it will stop ringing and the calling one will return to standby mode. Please note that additional handsets need to be registered to the base unit for this feature to be used.

#### 4.9.1 Intercom

## Using a handset:

- In idle mode, press RIGHT SOFTKEY and the numbers of the registered handsets will display except the calling handset.
- 2. Select the desired handset number that you want to intercom with.
- The called handset rings. Press \infty on the called handset to establish the internal call.

#### 4.9.2 Call All Handsets

#### Using a handset:

- In idle mode, press RIGHT SOFTKEY and the numbers of the registered handsets will display except the calling handset.
- 2. Select ALL to ring to all registered handsets.

#### 4.9.3 Transfer an External Call

#### Using a handset:

#### During an external call:

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY 
   and 
   T to select INTERCOM.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY to select the desired handset you want to intercom with.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and the external call is put on hold automatically and the called handset rings.
- 4. Press \(^\) on the called handset to establish an internal call.
- Press on the calling handset or put the calling handset on the charging cradle to end the current call with the external party.
- 6. The external call is transferred automatically to the called handset.

## 4.9.4 Make a 3-way Conference Call

The conference call feature allows one external call to be shared with two additional cordless handsets. The three parties can share the conversation. No network subscription is required.

## Using a handset: During the external call

- 1. Follow Steps 1 to 4 in section 4.9.3.
- Press and hold 

  → on the calling handset to establish the conference call.

#### NOTE:

Any party (corded base or cordless handset) hangs up during a conference call will leave the other party still in connection with the external call

# 5 PHONEBOOK

Your phone can store up to 50 phonebook entries in the cordless handset and the telephone base with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

## 5.1 Add a New Phonebook Entry

#### Using a handset:

#### In idle:

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY 
   and ▼ to select PHONEBOOK main menu item and then press LEFT SOFTKEY 
   to select ALL.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY to access the phonebook list.
- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to select **ADD**.
- 4. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** and enter the number.
- 5. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** and enter the name.
- 6. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY** to store the phonebook entry.

## 5.2 Search for a Phonebook Entry

## Using a handset:

#### In idle:

- Enter the phonebook list by press the key □▼
- Enter the first character of your desired name of the phonebook entries by pressing the appropriate numeric keypad button multiple times to select the letter of the alphabet.

## 5.3 View a Phonebook Entry

## Using a handset:

#### In idle:

- 1. Repeat the steps 1 to 2 in section 5.1 or press directly ♥▼.
- Press▲▼ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY ( and To select VIEW.

## 5.4 Edit a Phonebook Entry

#### Using a handset: In

#### idle:

- 1. Repeat the steps 1 to 2 in section 5.1 or press directly □▼.
- Press▲▼ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY and the current contents of the selected phonebook entry displays.
- Edit the number and press LEFT SOFTKEY .
- 6. Edit the name and press **LEFT SOFTKEY** ...
- 7. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY t**o confirm the setting.

Note: Use the RIGHT SOFTKEY To delete a character or a digit.

- 3. Press **LEFT SOFTKEY to** confirm

### 5.7 Check the Phonebook Usage

You can check how many phonebook entries have been occupied in your phone and how many phonebook entries are available for you to store in the phonebook.

#### Using a handset:

- 1. Repeat the steps 1 to 2 in section 5.1 or press directly ♥▼.
- Press LEFT SOFTKEY , the display shows "XX/50" (XX refer to the number of phonebook entries).
- 4. Press RIGHT SOFTKEY or fto EXIT.

## 5.8 Set the Speed Dial Numbers from 1 to 9

After setting the speed dial numbers, you can dial to the pre-set numbers by pressing and holding the respective digit keys (1-9 on the handset) in idle mode.

- Press LEFT SOFTKEY

If the caller's caller display function is disabled, "UNAVAIL" will be displayed.

If the call is an international call or with unknown number, "OUT OF AREA" will be displayed.

In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, "3 NEW CALLS" will be displayed. (as an example)

#### 6.1 View the Call List

All unanswered calls are saved in the calls log with the latest call at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with  $\bigstar$  icon.

# 13 ANSWERING MACHINE

Your telephone base includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. The answering machine can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time of approximately 30 minutes. As well as recording incoming messages, you can record memos for other users of your phone.

# 13.1 Switching Answering Machine On/Off

Using a handset:

- 1. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 
  and 
  √/▲ to select ANS.SYS.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 
  and ▼/▲ to select ON or OFF.

# 13.2 Play Messages on TAM

If you have new messages, the handset display will show e.g. 2 NEW MESSAGE, which means you have 2 new messages. New messages are played first, and then are saved as old messages, until they are deleted. Old messages are played again after all new messages are played completely.

**DELETE**: Delete the current message and the next message will be played.

If a personalized OGM is not recorded before, the pre-set OGM will be played.

#### 13.5.3 Delete a Personalized OGM (SET OGM to DEFAULT)

### Using a handset:

- 1. Repeat Steps 1 to 3 in the section 14.5.2.
- 2. Press LEFT SOFTKEY 
  and 
  To select DELETE.
- 3. Press LEFT SOFTKEY and RESET TO DEFAULT is displayed.

#### NOTE:

Your personalized OGM and return to previous menu and the pre-set OGM is restored automatically.

#### 13.5.4 Set the Answer Delay

You can set the number of rings before the answering machine answers and starts playing your OGM. You can set the answering machine to answer after two to ten rings or TIME SAVER.

The TIME SAVER function answers calls after 6 ring signals, until the first new message has been registered then the answering machine switches to answering after approximately 2 rings. This is useful when using remote access; if you call up the answering machine and there is no reply after four rings that means there are no messages recorded and you can hang up before you are charged for the call.

#### 13.5.6 Set the talking TAM Language

You can choose the voice prompt language of the answering machine from a total of 4 languages (English, Deutsch, Français and Nederlands).

- Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select TAM LANG.

#### 13.5.7 Turn On or Off the Base Screening

You can select to turn on or off the call screening on base. When the answering machine is set to ON and when there is an incoming message, the base will start call screening automatically after the preset numbers of rings of answer delay.

Use the 4-digit remote access PIN code to prevent other people from unauthorized access of your answering machine.

 When your answering machine memory is full and the answer mode is in ANS & RECORD, the answer mode will change to ANSWER ONLY automatically. It will change to ANS & RECORD mode automatically after some messages have been deleted.

# 14. ADDITIONNAL DEVICES

You have the possibility to register up to 4 handsets, 3 doorbells and several alerters on the AD595 ULE. All the devices are already paired in the factory when sold as a pack, therefore you will not need to register this device. If you need to pair another doorbell or alerter, please read the user guide of your device.

#### 14.1 SET DEVICE

Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SET DEVICES.

#### 1.1 CHECK SIGNAL:

**DOORBELL**: Press **MENU/OK** and on the doorbell button to check the quality of the signal.

**ALERTER:** Press **MENU/OK** to check the quality of the signal.

#### 1.2 DOORBELL:

This function is to be set:

**CHIME:** In this function, you can set the doorbell melody and volume when you press the doorbell button.

**RECORD?:** Set ON to record the conversation with the doorbell when you answer with the handset.

#### **DBELL DVRT:**

This function allows you to transfer the doorbell alert to another landline or mobile number if you are not going to be home.

**DVRT MODE** allows to set the function to be in manual, automatic or OFF.

**PRESET NUM:** allows you to enter the phone number for the diversion of the call when the doorbell is pressed.

#### 14.2 DEVICES

In this section, you can check the following:

Press MENU/OK 

and 

A/▼ to select DEVICES.

**STATUS:** This function will let you know if the device is activated to the base unit or not.

**LOG:** This function is to display the doorbell actions in a list (date/time etc)

**RENAME**: This function is to change the name of your device.

There is interference during a telephone conversation. My calls fade out when I am using the handset.

- The handset may be out of range. Move it closer to the telephone base.
- If you subscribe to high-speed Internet service (digital subscriber line - DSL) through your telephone line, you must install a DSL filter between the telephone base and the telephone wall jack. The filter prevents noise and caller ID problems caused by DSL interference. Please contact your DSL service provider for more information about DSL filters.
- Appliances or other cordless telephones plugged into the same circuit as the telephone base can cause interference
- Try moving the appliance or telephone base to another outlet.
- Other electronic products may cause interference to your cordless telephone. Install your telephone as far away as possible from the following electronic devices: wireless routers, radios, radio towers, pager towers, cellular telephones, digital telephones, intercoms, room monitors, televisions, VCRs, personal computers, kitchen appliances, and other cordless telephones.
- If your telephone is plugged in with a modem or a surge protector, plug the telephone (or modem/surge protector) into a different location. If this doesn't solve the problem, re-locate your telephone or modem farther apart from each other, or use a different surge protector.
- The location of your telephone base can impact the performance of your cordless phone. For better reception, install the telephone base in a centralized location within your home or office, away from walls or other obstructions. # Common cure for electronic equipment.

If the telephone is not responding normally, put the handset in the telephone base. If it does not respond, try the following (in the order listed):

- Disconnect the power to the telephone base.
- Disconnect the batteries on the handset.
- Wait a few minutes before connecting power to the telephone base.
- Re-install the batteries and place the handset in the telephone base.
- Wait for the handset to synchronize with the telephone base.
   Allow up to one minute for this to take place.

This telephone is not equipped with a grounding function! Therefore, some of the functions may be limited when used in PBX systems.
