# 2. SET UP THE TELEPHONE

## 2.1 PACKAGE CONTENTS

- 1 DECT Base
- 1 Cordless Handset (receiver)
- 1 Handset Base Charger (Charging cradle for charging the cordless handset)
- 2 Power Adapters (1 for the DECT Base, 1 for the Charger)
- 1 telephone line cord
- 2 1.2V/400mA NiMh batteries
- 1 Quick-Start User Guide

## 2.2 DECT Base Location

For best handset reception and coverage, and to reduce any interference, follow the guidelines below on where to locate the DECT Base.

- place the DECT base at a convenient height (e.g. on a table-top) and ideally at a central location with no obstructions between the DECT Base and handset, in an indoor environment.
- keep the DECT Base away from electronic appliances such as televisions, microwave ovens, radios, personal computers, wireless devices or other cordless phones.
- avoid locations where there are nearby radio frequency transmitters, such as mobile phone masts.
- to reduce the possibility of interference, avoid sharing the same mains electrical wall socket for DECT Base and other household electrical appliances. Try using a different mains electrical wall socket for the DECT Base or for the appliance.

Move the location of the DECT Base if the reception on the handset is not satisfactory.

The signal range between the DECT Base and handset maybe reduced due to surrounding conditions, distance and construction of the building.

## 2.3 Installation



#### **Connecting the telephone**

**DECT Base:** Connect one end of the supplied telephone line cord to the telephone line socket on the bottom of the base unit (TEL. LINE), and the other end of the line cord to either your (PSTN) telephone wall socket, a DSL filter, or to the Analogue Telephone Adapter (ATA) socket on your router. Connect the cable from the power adapter to the bottom of the DECT base then plug in the power adapter to a mains electrical wall socket (ideally one that doesn't have a wall switch).

Handset Base Charger: Connect the cable from the power adapter to the bottom of the Charger, then plug in the power adapter to a mains electrical wall socket (ideally one that doesn't have a wall switch).

Note: Only use the power adapters supplied with the phone.



## 2.4 Fitting the handset batteries



Charge the batteries for at least 12 hours when charging them for the first time.

Use only the power adapters and battery listed below.

# 3. FIRST TIME USING YOUR HANDSET

After fitting the batteries, you can select your language using the  $\checkmark$  keys. Press **MENU/OK** to confirm.

The display then reads "PLS SET TIME".

Press MENU/OK then with the ▼/▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press MENU/OK then with the ▼/▲ keys select "DATE & TIME". Press MENU/OK.

Press **MENU/OK** then with the ▼/▲ keys select "SET TIME".

Press **MENU/OK** then set the correct time (hours and minutes) using the keypad and confirm by pressing **MENU/OK**.

Enter the correct year using the keypad and confirm by pressing MENU/OK.

Enter the correct date using the keypad and confirm by pressing MENU/OK.

Note: If you receive a call and have subscribed to your provider's caller ID service, your phone will automatically set the correct date and time (but not the year).

## 4. MENU/OK ( 🕞 )

In idle mode: Press to access the main menu. In sub-menu mode: Press to confirm the selection. During a call: Press to access Intercom / Phonebook / Redial list / Call log.

## 5. UP/CALL LOG ( 👔 )

In idle mode: Press to access the call log.

In main menu mode: Press to scroll up the menu items.

In the phonebook / redial list / call log: Press to scroll up the list.

In editing mode: Press to move the cursor one character to the left.

During a call: Press to increase the listening volume.

When ringing: Press to increase the ringer volume.

## 6. TALK ON ( 💦 )

In idle / pre-dial mode: Press to make a call in earpiece mode.

In the phonebook / redial list / call log: Press to call a number stored in the phonebook in earpiece mode.

When ringing (incoming call): Press to answer a call in earpiece mode.

**During a call**: Press to answer another incoming call (if you have subscribed to a call waiting service from your network provider).

## 7. DOWN/REDIAL LIST ( 🔍 )

In idle mode: Press to access the redial list.

In main menu mode: Press to scroll down the menu items.

In the phonebook / redial list / call log: Press to scroll down the list.

In editing mode: Press to move the cursor one character to the right.

During a call: Press to decrease the listening volume.

When ringing: Press to decrease the ringer volume.

## 8. SPEAKERPHONE (

In idle /pre-dial mode: Press to make a call in speakerphone mode. Press again to switch to earpiece mode.

In the phonebook / redial list / call log: Press to call the selected number in speakerphone mode. Press again to switch to earpiece mode.

When ringing: Press to answer a call in speakerphone mode. Press again to switch to earpiece mode.

## 9. MICROPHONE

## 10. VOLUME BOOST ( →))

**During a call**: Press to turn on the VOLUME BOOST function. Press again to turn it off.

## 11. CANCEL/MUTE ( 👿 )

In main menu mode: Press to go back to the idle screen.

In sub-menu mode: - Press to go back to the previous menu.

- Press and hold to go back to the idle screen.

- In editing / recording a contact in the phonebook or blacklist / pre-dial mode:
- Press to delete a character /digit.
- Press and hold to delete all the characters / digits.

During a call: Press to mute / unmute the microphone.

In idle mode: Press to call another handset (intercom).

## 12. TALK OFF ( 🌈 )

During a call: Press to end a call and go back to the idle screen.

In main menu /editing mode: Press to go back to the previous menu.

In main menu / editing mode: Press and hold to go back to the idle screen.

When ringing: Press to mute the ringer.

In idle mode: Press and hold to power off the handset.

Press and hold to power on the handset when it is off.

## 13. ALPHANUMERIC KEYPAD, STAR (¥ ↔), HASH (# ×)

In pre-dial or editing mode: Press to enter the  $\bigstar$  or # character.

 $\mathbf{X}$  on key in idle mode: <u>Press and hold</u> to activate or deactivate the keypad lock function.

# 🕱 key in idle mode: <u>Press and hold</u> to turn on/off the ringer.

key in pre-dial / number editing mode: Press and hold to insert a space.

1,2,3 key in idle mode: Press and hold this key for 3 seconds to call the number saved in that key (speed dial function)

## 14. CALL BLOCK 🕑

When ringing (incoming call): Press this key then Menu/ OK to refuse the incoming call and add the number to the blacklist

## 15. PHONEBOOK ( 🗘 )

In idle mode: Press to access the phonebook.

## 4.2 Handset LCD Display Icons and Symbols



The screen display gives you information on the current status of the telephone.

#### 4.4 Text and Digit Entry Table

The following tables show you where each letter and punctuation character can be found. This will be helpful when storing a name in the phonebook or renaming your handset

In editing mode, a cursor is displayed to indicate the current text entry position. It is positioned at the right of the last character entered.

#### Writing Tips:

- 1. Once a character is selected, the cursor will move to the next position after a short pause.
- 2. You can move the cursor within the text by  $\blacktriangle/\nabla$  to amend the text entry.
- 3. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** on the handset to delete the last character.
- 4. <u>Press and hold</u> **RIGHT SOFTKEY** on the handset to delete the entire text string.

# 5. USING YOUR PHONE

## 5.1 Make an External Call

## 5.2 Direct Dialing

Press  $rac{1}{8}$  or  $rac{1}{8}$  to get a dial tone then dial the phone number.

## 5.3 Call from the Phonebook

Press  $\bigcirc$  to access the phonebook then using the  $\checkmark \blacktriangle$  keys select the desired entry in the phone book.

Press  $rac{1}{8}$  or  $rac{1}{8}$  to call the selected phone number.

Press *f* to end the call.

## 5.4 Call from the call log (20 last numbers)

Press ? to access the call log.

Use the  $\checkmark$  keys to select the desired entry in the call log.

Press nor it to call the selected phone number.

Press 🥟 to end the call.

## 5.5 Call from the redial list (10 last numbers)

Press 🌩 to access the redial list.

Use the  $\mathbf{\nabla} \mathbf{A}$  keys to select the desired entry in the redial list.

Press  $rac{1}{8}$  or  $rac{1}{8}$  to call the selected phone number.

Press 🌈 to end the call.

#### 5.6 Answer a Call

If the handset is not on the charging cradle, when the phone rings, press  $\mathbf{R}$  or  $\mathbf{I}$  to answer the call.

If the handset is on the charging cradle with **AUTO ANSWER** set to **ON**, when the phone rings, pick up the handset to answer.

## 5.7 BOOSTER Function

The BOOSTER function allows you to amplify the handset earpiece volume, which may make it easier to hear the call if you have hearing loss. **CAUTION: the handset** 

earpiece can be very loud when the BOOSTER function is on.

Press the 
 key at any time during a call. The display reads "BOOST ON". The red-light indicator above the handset's earpiece will turn on.

When the BOOSTER function is on, use the ▼ ▲ keys to increase or decrease the handset earpiece volume.

Press the 
 key again to turn off the BOOSTER function, the red-light indicator above the handset's earpiece will go off.

NOTE: The BOOSTER function is deactivated automatically at the end of each call.

#### 5.8 Adjust earpiece and speaker volume

There are 5 volume levels to choose from (VOLUME 1 to VOLUME 5) for the earpiece and speaker volume.

**During a call:** Use the  $\checkmark$  keys to set the volume to the desired level. The current level is shown on the display. NOTE: The volume level is not reset at the end of the call, it will remain at the last selected volume level for future calls.

#### 5.9 Call Timer

The handset will automatically time the duration of each call. The call time will show on the handset display shortly after the call has ended. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM:SS).

#### 5.10 End a Call

During a call, press *f* to end the call.

#### OR

Put the cordless handset on the charging cradle to end the call.

#### 5.11 Mute a Call

With the call muted, you can talk to someone nearby without letting the caller hear you during a call.

#### During a call:

Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (a) to mute the microphone, "MUTED" will be displayed on the handset screen. Your caller cannot hear you. Press **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (a) again to unmute the microphone.

## 5.12 Set the Handset Silent Mode

In idle mode, press and hold  $\# \boxtimes$  to turn off the handset ringer. The # symbol will be displayed on the handset screen.

In silent mode, press and hold # is to turn on the handset ringer. The 🕻 symbol will disappear.

#### 5.13 Set the Handset Keypad Lock

You can turn the keypad lock on or off. When the keypad lock is on, it prevents accidental operation of the handset.

In idle mode, press and hold  $\bigstar$  to turn on the keypad lock. The **f** symbol will display on the handset screen.

In keypad lock mode, press and hold  $\bigstar$  to turn off the keypad lock. The for symbol will disappear.

## 5.14 Find the Handset

This feature helps you to find misplaced handset(s).

You can locate the handset from the DECT base station as below.

In idle mode, press //HANDSETLOCATOR.

All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone. "PAGING" will flash on the handset display. You can stop the paging by pressing  $\mathbb{R} / \P$  / /

## Press the **RIGHT SOFTKEY** (a) on any handset or (A)/HANDSET LOCATOR on the

DECT base to stop paging.

#### NOTE:

If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call.

## 5.15 Redial the Last Number

You can redial up to 10 last called numbers. If you have stored a name in the phonebook to match with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recently dialed number will be displayed at the top of the redial list.

## 5.15.1 Redial a Number from the Redial List

- 1. In idle mode, press  $\P$  to access the redial list.
- Press ▼▲ to browse the redial list.
- 3. Press no dial the selected redial number.

#### NOTE:

If there is no number in the redial list, the display will show "EMPTY".

## 5.15.2 Store a Redial Number into the Phonebook

In idle mode, press v to access the redial list.

Press  $\blacksquare$  to browse the redial list.

- 1. Press **MENU / OK** ( $\blacksquare$ ) then use the **V**  $\blacktriangle$  keys to select **ADD TO PB**.
- 2. Press MENU / OK then enter the name.
- 3. Press MENU / OK then check the phone number
- 4. Press MENU / OK to save

Note: To delete one character or digit, press RIGHT SOFTKEY 🐨

## 5.15.3 Delete a Redial Number

In idle mode, press ♥ to access the redial list. Press ▼▲ to browse the redial list. Press MENU / OK (m) then use the ▼▲ keys to select DELETE. Press MENU / OK, "CONFIRM" is displayed. Press MENU / OK to confirm.

## 5.15.4 Delete the Entire Redial List

In idle mode, press  $\P$  to access the redial list. Press  $\P \blacktriangle$  to browse the redial list. Press **MENU / OK** ( $\blacksquare$ ) then use the  $\P \blacktriangle$  keys to select **DELETE ALL**. Press **MENU / OK**, "CONFIRM" is displayed. Press **MENU / OK** to confirm.

## 5.16 Call transfer or 3-way conference function

#### 5.16.1 Make an Internal Call

This feature allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls and make conference calls. If the called handset is not answered within 60 seconds, it will stop ringing and the handset from which the internal call is made will return to standby mode.

#### 5.16.2 Intercom

- 1. In idle mode, press the **RIGHT SOFTKEY** and the numbers of the registered handsets will be displayed (except the calling handset).
- 2. Select the desired handset number that you want to intercom with.
- 3. The called handset rings. Press no the called handset to establish the internal call.

#### 5.16.3 Transfer an External Call

#### During an external call:

- 2. Press MENU / OK to select the desired handset you want to intercom with.
- 3. The external call is put on hold automatically and the called handset rings.
- Press not ■) on the called handset to establish an internal call.
- Press 
   for on the calling handset or put the calling handset on the charging cradle
   to end the current call with the external party.
- 6. The external call is now transferred to the called handset.

#### 5.16.4 Make a 3-way Conference Call

The conference call feature allows one external call to be shared with the caller and up to two handsets. The three parties can share the conversation and no network subscription is required.

#### During the external call:

- 2. Press MENU / OK to select the desired handset you want to intercom with.
- 3. The external call is put on hold automatically and the called handset rings.
- Press not ■) on the called handset to establish an internal call.

5. <u>Press and hold</u> on the calling handset to establish the conference call. **NOTE:** 

Any party in a conference call (whether from a handset or base) can hang up. The other party/parties will still be connected to the external call.

# 6. PHONEBOOK

Up to 60 names and numbers can be stored in the Liberty200's phonebook for both regular and VIP contacts. The phone numbers saved in the phonebook can have up to 24 digits. Contact names cannot have more than 12 characters. It is possible to have a specific ringtone for each phonebook entry.

Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

Use the  $\textcircled{\baselinetwidth}$  key to delete a character, and the  $\textcircled{\baselinetwidth}$  key to confirm.

## 6.1 Adding a new phonebook entry

Press **MENU/OK** and using the ▼ ▲ keys select "PHONEBOOK", then press **MENU/OK**, "ALL CONTACTS" is shown on the display.

Press **MENU/OK** twice, "ADD" is shown on the display.

Press MENU/OK, the display now shows "NAME", now enter the name.

Press MENU/OK, the display now shows "NUMBER", now enter the number.

Press **MENU/OK** and using the  $\mathbf{V} \mathbf{A}$  keys select the desired ringtone for your phonebook entry.

Press MENU/OK to save.

#### 6.2 Dial a Phonebook Entry

Press directly 🗘.

Press the  $\mathbf{\nabla} \mathbf{A}$  keys to select the desired phonebook entry then press  $\mathbf{R}$  to dial.

#### 6.3 Adding a contact in the VIP phonebook

Press **MENU/OK** () and using the ▼ ▲ keys select "PHONEBOOK" then press **MENU/OK**, the display reads "ALL CONTACTS".

Press MENU/OK to access the phonebook.

Select the contact to place in the VIP phonebook using the ▼▲ keys.

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "ADD.TO VIP"

Press MENU/OK to confirm.

#### 6.4 Edit or View one contact in phonebook

Press MENU/OK () and using the ▼▲ keys select "PHONEBOOK".

Press MENU/OK, the display reads "ALL CONTACTS".

Select the contact to Edit or View in the phonebook using the  $\mathbf{V} \mathbf{A}$  keys.

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼▲ keys select EDIT or VIEW.

Press **MENU/OK**, the display reads "NAME", press **Cancel/ Mute** to delete incorrect characters then enter the correct name.

Press **MENU/OK**, the display reads "NUMBER », press **Cancel/ Mute** to delete the incorrect digit then enter the correct phone number.

Press **MENU/OK** and using the  $\bigvee \blacktriangle$  keys select the desired ringtone for your phonebook entry.

Press MENU/OK to save.

## 6.5 Deleting contacts from the phonebooks

Press **MENU/OK** and using the ▼ ▲ keys select "PHONEBOOK", then press **MENU/OK**. Select "ALL CONTACTS" or "VIP", then press **MENU/OK** to access the phonebook. Select the contact to delete then press **MENU/OK** 

Select "DELETE" or to delete all the contacts in the phonebook "DELETE ALL".

Press MENU/OK, the display reads "CONFIRM".

Press MENU/OK to confirm.

#### 6.6 Check the Phonebook Usage

You can check how many phonebook entries are stored in your phone, and how many phonebook entries are available for you to store more entries.

Press MENU/OK () and using the ▼ ▲ keys select "PHONEBOOK"

Press MENU/OK, the display reads "ALL CONTACTS".

Press MENU/OK twice then using the ▼ ▲ keys select PB STATUS.

Press **MENU/OK**, the display reads « XX/60 » (XX is the number of phonebook and VIP entries).

Press MENU/OK to exit.

# **<u>7</u>**CALL BLOCKER FUNCTION

This feature allows you to block the calls coming from the numbers you have saved in the blacklist, which can contain up to 60 contacts. You have the option to reject all calls from blacklisted numbers, all calls, or all calls except those from regular and VIP contacts, and all private or unknown numbers.

## 7.1 Using the call block key

When ringing: Press the call block key **(**) then **MENU/OK**. The phone stops ringing and the number is automatically added to the blacklist.

#### 7.2 Adding a black listed phone number

Press MENU/OK, "CALL BLOCKER" is shown on the display. Press MENU/OK 3 times, "ADD" is now shown on the display. Press MENU/OK then enter the name. Press MENU/OK then enter the number. Press MENU/OK to save.

#### 7.3 Activating the black list function

You can either block all the incoming calls, authorize only the VIP or phonebook numbers, or deactivate the black list function.

Press MENU/OK , "CALL BLOCKER" is shown on the display.

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼/▲ keys select "SETTINGS".

Press MENU/OK, "BLOCK MODE" is shown on the display.

Press MENU/OK then choose between "OFF", "BLOCK ALL", "ALLOW PB" or "ALLOW VIP".

Press MENU/OK to confirm your choice, the V symbol is shown on the display.

## 7.4 Activating the function to block the private, international, payphone, or unavailable numbers

Press **MENU/OK** . "CALL BLOCKER" is shown on the display. Press **MENU/OK** then using the **▼**/**▲** keys select "SETTINGS". Press **MENU/OK** then using the ▼/▲ keys select "CALL TYPE". Press MENU/OK and choose between "WITHHELD", "INTENAT'L", "UNAVAILBLE" or "PAYPHONE".

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼/▲ keys select "ON" Press MENU/OK to confirm.

## 7.5 Deleting one or all black listed numbers

ightarrow Every month, we advise you to delete 30 phone numbers from your blacklist so that it

does not remain filled with numbers that are no longer trying to call you.

Press **MENU/OK** (**•**), "CALL BLOCKER" is shown on the display.

Press MENU/OK twice, then using the ▼/▲ keys choose the black listed phone number to be deleted.

Press **MENU/OK** then using the **V**/**▲** keys select "DELETE" or "DELETE ALL".

Press MENU/OK. the display reads "CONFIRM?".

Press MENU/OK to confirm.

#### 7.6 Edit or view one black listed number

Press MENU/OK , "CALL BLOCKER" is shown on the display.

Press MENU/OK twice, then using the ▼/▲ keys choose the blacklisted phone number to delete.

Press **MENU/OK** then using the  $\nabla/A$  keys select **EDIT** or **VIEW**.

Press MENU/OK, the display reads "NAME", press Cancel/ Mute To delete an incorrect character then enter the correct name.

Press MENU/OK, the display reads "NUMBER", press Cancel/ Mute ( ) to delete the incorrect digit then enter the correct phone number.

Press MENU/OK to save.

# **<u>8</u>** CALLER DISPLAY(NETWORK DEPENDENT)

This feature is available if you have subscribed to the Caller Identification service from your network provider. Your phone's call log can store the 20 last received calls with date and timestamp. The number is shown on the display when the phone is ringing. If the number matches with one of the entries in the phonebook, the caller's name that is saved in the phonebook is displayed along with the number. The ringtone will be the one associated with that phonebook entry. When in idle mode, in the event that three calls were missed, the display reads "3 NEW CALLS".

#### 8.1 View the Call Log

All missed and accepted calls are saved in the call log with the latest call at the top of the list. If the call log is full and a new call is received, the oldest call in the call log will be deleted and replaced. Unanswered calls are identified with the **x** icon.

Press the 2 key to access the call log.

Use the  $\mathbf{\nabla} \mathbf{A}$  keys to see the previous calls.

#### 8.2 More information on the call log

It is possible to retrieve more information on missed calls (Date, Hour and phone number).

Press 2 to access the call log then press the  $\nabla/\triangle$  keys to select the desired call list entry.

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼/▲ keys select "DETAILS".

The phone displays the date, hour and phone number of the missed call entry.. Press  $\checkmark$  to exit.

#### 8.3 Store a Call List Number into the Phonebook

Press  $\sqrt{2}$  to access the call log then  $\nabla/\Delta$  to select the desired call list entry.

Press **MENU/OK** then using the ▼/▲ keys select "ADD TO PB".

Press **MENU/OK** then enter the name. Press **Cancel/ Mute**  $\bigcirc$  to delete the bad characters then enter the correct name.

Press **MENU/OK** then check the phone number. Press **Cancel/ Mute** () to delete the bad number then enter the correct phone number.

Press **MENU/OK** then using the  $\checkmark$  keys select the desired ringtone for your phonebook entry.

Press MENU/OK to save.

## 8.4 Store a Call List Number into the Blacklist

Press 2 to access the call log then  $\mathbf{V}/\mathbf{A}$  to select the desired call list entry.

Press **MENU/OK** then using the **▼**/**▲** keys select "ADD TO BLIST".

Press **MENU/OK** then enter the name. Press **Cancel/ Mute**  $\bigcirc$  to delete the bad characters then enter the correct name.

Press **MENU/OK** then check the phone number. Press **Cancel/ Mute** (not the bad number then enter the correct phone number. Press **MENU/OK** to save.

## 8.5 Delete an Entry or the entire Call List

Press **№** to access the call log then **▼**/▲to select the desired call list entry. Press **MENU/OK** then using the **▼**/▲ keys select "DELETE" or "DELETE ALL". Press **MENU/OK**, the display reads "CONFIRM?". Press **MENU/OK** to confirm.

#### 8.6 Choosing the type of list of received calls to display

If you go to the list of received calls, a list of received and missed calls is displayed. If you wish, you can also display only missed calls.

Press 2 to access the call log then  $\mathbf{V}/\mathbf{A}$  to select the desired call list entry.

Press **MENU/OK** then using the **▼**/**▲** keys select "CATEGORY".

Press **MENU/OK** then using the  $\mathbf{V}/\mathbf{A}$  keys select "ALL CALLS" or "MISSED CALLS". Press **MENU/OK** to confirm.

## 9. PHONE SETTINGS

The Liberty 200 has a selection of settings that allows you to personalize the way it works.

## 9.1 Alarm Settings

You can use this phone to set an alarm. When an alarm is set, the 😧 symbol is shown on the handset display. When the alarm goes off, the 🕺 symbol and the words "ALARM ON" will flash on the display. The phone will ring for 45 seconds. Press any key to mute the alarm. If the snooze function is activated, the alarm will go off for seven minutes then restart. To deactivate the alarm function, you need to select "OFF" as described below.

#### NOTES:

- a) Pressing on a key to mute the alarm works even if the handset's keypad is locked.
- b) The volume (loudness) of the alarm is the same as that set for the ringer. NOTE: If the ringer is deactivated (volume set to OFF), the volume of the alarm will be set at VOLUME 1.
- c) If you are on a call at the same time the alarm goes off, the x symbol and "ALARM ON" will flash on the display. A tone will be heard in the earpiece to notify you that the time set for the alarm has been reached. Pressing any key or pressing and holding the key mutes the alarm and the display will return to the call duration screen.
- d) If the snooze function is activated, the alarm will go off again at the end of the set snooze period. NOTE: Complete deactivation of the alarm is required via the menu in order to stop the alarm ringing every seven minutes.

#### 9.2 Turn on/off the alarm

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼▲ keys select "ALARM".

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "ON" or "OFF" (deactivated).

Press MENU/OK then enter the alarm time.

Press MENU/OK, the display reads "SNOOZE".

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "ON" or "OFF"

Press MENU/OK to confirm.

#### 9.3 Set the ringer melody for external calls

You can select a melody to personalise the ringtone for an incoming external call. There are 10 melodies to choose from..

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "RING SETUP".

Press MENU/OK, the display reads "EXT RING".

Press **MENU/OK** then using the  $\checkmark$  keys select the desired melody for your external calls.

**NOTE:** The melodies are played while you are browsing the melody list.

Press MENU/OK to confirm.

#### 9.4 Set the ringer melody for internal calls

You can select a melody to personalise the ringtone for an internal call. There are 10 melodies to choose from.

Press MENU/OK ( then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "RING SETUP".

Press MENU/OK, the display reads "INT RING".

Press **MENU/OK** then using the  $\checkmark$  keys select the desired melody for your internal calls.

**NOTE:** The melodies are played while you are browsing the melody list. Press **MENU/OK** to confirm.

#### 9.5 Set the ringer volume

You can set the ringer volume level. There are 6 volume levels to choose from, including VOLUME OFF which turns off the ringer.

Press MENU/OK ( then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press **MENU/OK** then using the **▼** ▲ keys select "RING SETUP".

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼▲ keys select "RING VOLUME".

Press **MENU/OK** then using the ▼▲ keys select the desired ringer volume. To help you choose, you will hear your phone ring at the volume level (loudness) shown on the display.

If "OFF" is selected, the symbol will appear on the display (the ringer will be set to OFF). Press **MENU/OK** to confirm.

#### 9.6 Set Alert Tone

You have the possibility to set 3 different setting. A single beep is emitted when you press any a key. You can turn this on or off. You can also turn on the alert tones when low battery and out of range are detected. The low battery tone will be emitted during a call to alert you that the handset battery needs to be charged.

Press MENU/OK ( then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press **MENU/OK** then using the  $\checkmark$  keys select **TONE SETUP**.

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼ ▲ keys select KEY TONE/ BATTERY TONE/ OUT OF RANGE.

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼ ▲ keys select ON or OFF.

Press **MENU/OK** to confirm.

#### 9.7 Set the language

You can choose the language to be displayed on the handset screen. There are 6 languages to choose from: English, French, Deutsch, Italian, Spanish and Dutch.

Press MENU/OK ( then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press MENU/OK then select "LANGUAGE"

Press MENU/OK then using the VA keys select the desired language.

Press MENU/OK to confirm.

#### 9.8 Rename the Handset

At the start, the name write on your display is handset. You have the possibility to change as follow:

Press MENU/OK ( then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press MENU/OK then using the ▼▲ keys select "RENAME HS".

Press **MENU/OK** then press **Cancel/ Mute** to delete handset then enter the correct name with the keypad.

Press MENU/OK to confirm

#### 9.9 Activate the auto answer function

By activating the auto answer function, you will be able to answer a call simply by picking up the cordless handset from its charging cradle without pressing any key.

Press MENU/OK () then using the ▼▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS". Press MENU/OK then using the ▼▲ keys select "AUTO ANSWER". Press MENU/OK then using the ▼▲ keys select "ON" or "OFF". Press MENU/OK to confirm.

## 9.10 Clock Settings

You will need to set the correct date and time so that you know when you received call list entries.

#### 9.10.1 Set the Date format

Press MENU/OK ( then with the ▼/▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press **MENU/OK** then with the ▼/▲ keys select "DATE & TIME".

Press **MENU/OK** then with the **▼**/▲ keys select "DATE FORMAT".

Press **MENU/OK** then with the  $\forall/\blacktriangle$  keys select your desired date format (DD--MM--YY or MM--DD--YY).

Press MENU/OK to confirm.

#### 9.10.2 Set the time format

Press **MENU/OK**  $\bigcirc$  then with the  $\bigvee A$  keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press **MENU/OK** then with the ▼/▲ keys select "DATE & TIME".

Press MENU/OK then with the ▼/▲ keys select "TIME FORMAT".

Press **MENU/OK** then with the  $\bigvee / \blacktriangle$  keys select your desired time format (12h or 24h). Press **MENU/OK** to confirm.

#### 9.10.3 Set Date & Time

Press MENU/OK ( then with the ▼/▲ keys select "HS SETTINGS".

Press **MENU/OK** then with the ▼/▲ keys select "DATE & TIME".

Press MENU/OK.

Press MENU/OK then with the ▼/▲ keys select "SET TIME".

Press **MENU/OK** then set the correct time (hours and minutes) using the keypad, then confirm by pressing **MENU/OK**.

Enter the correct year using the keypad and confirm by pressing **MENU/OK**.

Enter the correct date using the keypad and confirm by pressing MENU/OK.

**NOTE**: If you receive a call and have subscribed to your provider's caller ID service, your phone will automatically set the correct date and time (but not the year).

#### 9.11 Set the speed dial numbers

The default dial mode is best suitable for your country and network operator. **NOTE:** It is unlikely that you should need to change this setting unless advised to do so.

Press MENU/OK ( then with the ▼/▲ keys select "BS SETTINGS".

Press MENU/OK then with the ▼/▲ keys select "DIAL MODE".

Press **MENU/OK** then with the ▼/▲ keys select your desired dial mode (**TONE** or **PULSE**). Press **MENU/OK** to confirm.

#### 9.12.3 Set the Flash Time

The default flash time is best suitable for your country and network operator. **NOTE: It is unlikely that you should need to change this setting unless advised to do so.** 

Press MENU/OK ( then with the ▼/▲ keys select "BS SETTINGS".

Press MENU/OK then with the ▼/▲ keys select "FLASH TIME".

Press MENU/OK then with the ▼/▲ keys select your desired flash time (SHORT 100ms,

MEDIUM 300ms, LONG 600ms).

Press MENU/OK to confirm.

#### 9.12.4 Change the System PIN Code

A 4-digit system PIN code is used for changing the system settings of the handset base charger. It is used to protect your phone against unauthorized use. **NOTE: The default system PIN code is 0000. If you change the system PIN code, make sure you make a note of it for future reference, but don't keep the new PIN code near the phone.** 

Press MENU/OK ( then with the ▼/▲ keys select "BS SETTINGS".

Press MENU/OK then with the ▼/▲ keys select "CHANGE PIN".

Press MENU/OK then you are requested to enter the old 4-digit system PIN.

Press MENU/OK then you are requested to enter the new 4-digit system PIN.

Press **MENU/OK**, the display reads "CONFIRM", enter the new 4-digit system PIN. Press **MENU/OK** to confirm.

#### 9.12.5 Set the eco mode

Eco mode reduces the operating distance between the handset and the DECT base station (reduced system range).

Press MENU/OK ( then with the ▼/ ▲ keys select "BS SETTINGS".

Press **MENU/OK** then with the  $\mathbf{V}/\mathbf{A}$  keys select "ECO MODE".

Press **MENU/OK** then using the  $\checkmark$  keys select "ON" or "OFF".

Press MENU/OK to confirm.

## **10.HANDSET REGISTRATION**

**NOTE**: The handset and the DECT Base are pre-paired. It is possible to add additional handsets. A maximum of 5 handsets can be paired to the DECT Base. The default PIN code to enter when pairing a handset is **0000** 

#### Pairing an additional handset

On the DECT Base, press and hold the HANDSET LOCATOR key to enter pairing mode.

**On the handset**: press **MENU/OK**, then using the **▼** ▲ keys select "REGISTRATION" Press **MENU/OK** then enter the 4-digit PIN.

Press MENU/OK.

After a short while, the handset display will return to the idle screen and show the new handset number.

## **11.Reset Your Phone**

You can reset your phone to the default settings. After reset, all your personal settings and call list entries will be deleted, but your phonebook list remains unchanged.

Press MENU/OK ( then using the ▼ ▲ keys select "DEFAULT".

Press **MENU/OK** then you are requested to enter the 4-digit system PIN (default PIN is 0000)

Press MENU/OK, the display reads "CONFIRM".

Press MENU/OK to confirm.
